

### How does research influence policy?

- Communicating and disseminating analytical findings. Helping colleagues, stakeholders, public interpret them.
- Informing decisions on difficult trade-offs and whether to stop, continue or change a policy.
- Designing and conducting impact evaluations.
- Collecting and analysing monitoring data, conducting process evaluations.




- Horizon scanning, identifying and interpreting issues, trends and gaps.
- Presenting options (and their costs, benefits and risks)
- assess social, environmental and economic impacts.
- Specify and gather new evidence.
- Test and assess ideas.
- Translate research into practical options.
- Define measurable outcomes and success criteria.




